Did you know Girl Scout Gold Award recipients stand out in college admissions, earn college scholarships, and enter the military one rank higher than their peers? And women who were Girl Scouts have more successful careers, earn higher household and personal incomes, and are more active mentors and community volunteers.

Getting the Troop Year started!

Congratulations—You're going to love being a Girl Scout Leader! You will introduce girls to new and awesome experiences and show them numerous ways to unleash the G.I.R.L within! To get the fun started, let this be your guide to make sure you're ready to make memories that will last a lifetime. Use this checklist to guide you as you get started:

Checklist for NEW Leaders:

- Register to be a GSSEM Troop Leader at **gssem.org/volunteer**.
- Complete your background check online. Once your background check is approved, you will receive an email confirmation prompting you to log into MyGS (your Girl Scout Member Community) on **gssem.org** and outlining your next steps including proper training. You will receive your troop number once you register and have an eligible background check. You will also be assigned a Troop Support Specialist.
- □ Visit **gssem.org/learning** and check out the Getting Started section.
- □ Invite girls and other adults to join your troop!
- □ Log into **MyGS** and check out the Volunteer Toolkit! VTK has detailed plans and a calendar outline to help you have a successful year.
- □ Set up the days, times and location for troop meetings on VTK. Be sure to attend a District Leaders' Meeting in your area. Your Troop Support Specialist will provide more information on meeting dates and times, or you can find your meeting at **gssem.org/calendar**.
- Meet with your other Troop Volunteers to make plans for the next year and assign roles.



- Reach out to parents via a meeting or other communications to solicit support for the troop. After the meeting, make sure to log into **MyGS** and update your new troop information.
- Open your Girl Scout bank account: Visit **gssem.org/learning** and check out the Group Finances section.
- Host your FIRST GIRL SCOUT MEETING!

Checklist for RETURNING Leaders:

- Make sure your login information for **MyGS** is up to date.
- □ If your troop is under 12 members, your troop will automatically be displayed in our Opportunity Catalog for new members. When new girls select your troop, you will begin receiving emails.
- $\hfill\square$ Be sure and watch for GSSEM email newsletters for Troop Leaders.
- □ Make sure your training is up to date: Check out **gssem.org/learning**.
- □ Schedule a meeting with parents to get them involved in the troop!
- Attend a District Leaders' meeting: check **gssem.org/calendar** for dates and locations.
- Host your FIRST GIRL SCOUT MEETING of the YEAR!

Remember, we're here for you every step of the way! If you need help, simply reach out to your Troop Support Specialist. If you don't know who your Specialist is, call **(800) 482-6734**, and select the option for Troop Support. We'll get you connected!

Great volunteer resources

GSSEM has many resources that will be helpful when running your troop throughout the year:

Supplemental Learning Modules (SLaM): SLaMs are online volunteer learning opportunities in the form of short videos and interactive modules that help you better understand a process or procedure—from help with managing your Member Profile to Demystifying the Volunteer Relations Process, to how to use the Volunteer Toolkit. Check them out at gssem.org/learning.



Volunteer Essentials: This valuable guide includes information about engaging girls, safety requirements, managing finances, and volunteer policies. There's even a glossary of Girl Scout terms! Check it out at **gssem.org/ve.**

Safety Activity Checkpoints: These help volunteers plan activities with girls. You should check to see if the activity you are planning has specific requirements covered in the Safety Activity Checkpoints. This will help ensure that you put on a safe event in compliance with Girl Scout policies. This list is found on page 14 of the Volunteer Essentials document.

GSSEM Online Directory: Have a question and need to contact us? Find the staff directory at **gssem.org/stafflist**.

Case Management System: Anytime you contact us through the Contact Us Form on **gssem.org/contact**, a case is created that will be viewed by multiple staff members to ensure your inquiry is resolved quickly.

Raising Awesome Girls: Visit the For Adults section of **girlscouts.org** for great resources to help you support girls in almost every facet of their lives.

What volunteers need to know about troop finances

Bank Account: All troops must establish a bank account with two unrelated adult signers for collection of payments of troop supplies and activities, and for the fall and cookie sales. Check out the Troop Banking Information at **gssem.org/bankaccount.**

Financial Assistance: Financial assistance is provided to help girls and adults participate in Girl Scouting. Any member needing financial assistance for membership can request it during the online registration process. Other financial assistance exists for books, badges, uniforms, and programs. The Financial Assistance application can be found at **gssem.org/forms**.

Money-Earning Activities: The Cookie program is the primary money-earning activity for a troop. You can also request a limited number of additional fundraising activities. The Money Earning Project Request form can be found at **gssem.org/moneyearning**.

Reporting and Receipts: Every troop should report out the troop finances to parents at least three times a year.



Volunteer Toolkit gives you more time with your girls!

Wish there was a way for you to keep everything for your whole Girl Scout year in once place? This is it: The Volunteer Toolkit (VTK) is the #1 tool every Leader needs for a successful Girl Scout year! It has detailed plans for the troop year and outlines everything you need so you can concentrate on your girls:

- Choose a year plan or design your own
- Set meeting locations, dates and times
- Includes meeting plans, agendas, and material lists
- · Communicate easily with everyone in your troop
- Track troop finances, badges earned, Journeys completed, attendance
- See important Council dates right in your year plan
- Changes are as easy as "drag and drop"

It's a full year of Girl Scouting accessible from your computer or mobile device and it's easy to get started: Log on to **gssem.org**. If you are an approved troop volunteer and have registered or renewed your membership, click on **MyGS** in the green navigation bar. Follow the log-in instructions and you can access VTK from a landing page. *Check out the Video Trainings at gssem.org/vtk.*

High Awards help girls find their spark, ignite change

Bronze, Silver, and Gold Awards represent the highest honors a Girl Scout can earn at each level! These three awards allow girls to select an issue they care about and inspire others to make changes. Girls can make a difference in their corner of the world—and maybe even beyond!



Bronze Award: This is for Girl Scouts in 4th or 5th grade who have completed a Junior Journey. Bronze Award Projects must be done as part of a team. Bronze awards are approved by the troop leader. No paperwork is submitted to GSSEM.



Silver Award: This is for Girl Scouts in 6th-8th grades who have completed a Cadette Journey. Girls can work on their own or build a team of no more than 2 - 4 girls. Silver Award final reports are approved by the troop leader and submitted to GSSEM for review.



Gold Award: This is the highest award a Girl Scout can earn. Girls in the 9th - 12th grade who have completed a Silver Award and one Senior or Ambassador Journey or have completed two Senior or Ambassador Journeys are eligible to earn their Gold Award. A Gold Award project is earned independently by a girl who is mentored by a GSSEM Volunteer Gold Award Committee Member. Each Gold Awardee receives a GSSEM \$500 scholarship.

All Silver and Gold Final Reports must be submitted to GSSEM by March 1 to be included in the 2018 Honor Reception.

GSSEM Precious Medals P.I. Patch Program: This patch program is available for girls to learn more about the highest awards in Girl Scouting. Have fun being a Precious Medals Private Eye and discover mysteries surrounding the Bronze, Silver, and Gold Awards. Activities are available for each program level!

GSSEM Young Woman of Distinction: Each year, GSSEM selects a Gold Award recipient whose final project demonstrates extraordinary leadership and addresses a global issue with measurable and sustainable impact. This candidate receives additional scholarship money.

National Young Woman of Distinction: Each year, GSSEM selects three exceptional recipients of the Gold Award to be considered: by GSUSA. Ten outstanding Gold Awardees are selected nationwide whose projects demonstrate extraordinary leadership, has measurable impact and sustainability, and addresses a local, national or global issue.

GSSEM's annual Fall Sale is an opportunity for girls to make sure they can pay for their Scouting year's must-do list by selling candy, nuts, and magazines. Girls not only learn vital skills when selling and managing their product sales, they can also earn money for things like camping, programs, and more. Girls will be able to sell magazine subscriptions AND candy/nuts online using their own avatar created with M2Media! They can also choose to sell the candy and nuts with a paper form. Girls can sell one or both products.

Our partner for the candy and nut portion of the fall sale is Trophy Nut Company and our partner for the magazine sales is M2 Media Group. **Troops earn 95 cents per candy and nut item sold and \$1.50 for each magazine subscription.**

For 2017, the fall sale program is once again short enough to allow everyone to wrap up the program before Thanksgiving and have more of a break before Girl Scout Cookie season begins:

GSSEM is once again teaming with Boy Scouts of America Great Lakes Council from Nov. 4-11 for **Scouting for Food**. This community service project addresses the problem of hunger in the communities where we all live and work. Gleaners Community Food Bank is our collaborative partner to distribute the food. Gleaners' distributes more than 34 million pounds of food to area residents each year. This year's goal for the Scouts is to collect 225,000 pounds of food!

Girl Scouts and Boy Scouts will distribute specially marked food donation bags in neighborhoods throughout their



service areas including communities stretching from Wayne to Oakland and Macomb Counties, and Sanilac and Monroe Counties. Individuals who receive Girl Scout or Boy Scout Scouting for Food bags, and would like to donate can leave non-perishable canned or boxed foods in the bags and place them on their porches for Scouts to pick-up on Saturday, Nov. 11. Food in glass containers will not be accepted.





Girl Scouts have been earning their high awards since 1916! These high awards mark important milestones in a girls' journey through Girl Scouts. Whether as a Junior earning the Bronze, Cadette earning the Silver or Senior/ Ambassador earning the Gold, girls get more out of Girl Scouting when they earn high awards. Earning these awards helps girls to discover what they really care about, and learn to build a team to take action toward making real change in their communities, and even the world. Our Precious Medal award provides recognition to girls who have earned all three highest awards (Bronze, Silver and Gold).

GSSEM honors medal and special award recipients at a Honor Award ceremony. Each year, GSSEM recognizes one outstanding Gold Award recipient as the GSSEM Young Woman of Distinction, who has excelled in creating a measurable and sustainable outcome in her take action project. The 2017 YWOD is **Madeline Burgin** of Warren for her Gold Award project entitled, "STEM Workshops at Green Acres Elementary School."

"Nationwide, there is an extreme shortage of women in STEM. Women make up approximately half of the U.S. college-educated workforce, but only 28.4% of science and engineering jobs are filled by women (National Science Foundation)," said Burgin who implemented an after-school STEM program at Green Acres Elementary School. "One of the most important goals for my project was to ensure that every girl had fun and was able to see STEM in a fun and positive light. On the surveys, 100% of girls from each session said that they had fun. To me, this fun aspect of my project was a huge success, because it is important in today's society that girls know STEM subjects are fun inside and outside of school."

Burgin attended Warren Mott High School and the Macomb Mathematics Science Technology Center. She is a member of Troop 30877. As the GSSEM Young Woman of Distinction, Burgin also earns an additional \$2,500

scholarship provided by the generosity of the Nancy L. Philippart and Thomas F. McGrail Fund.
